The first page of the paper should contain the title, authors' names, affiliations, addresses, telephone numbers, fax numbers and e-mail addresses. The abstract should not exceed 250 words and should contain at least three (3) keywords and the JEL code(s).

Authors are invited to submit their papers after the conference for consideration for publication in SER, subject to the usual refereeing process.

#### Important Dates

Full papers or abstracts are to be submitted by 31 March 2009. The authors will be notified of a decision by 30 April 2009. To enjoy the early bird discount for registration, the participants need to register before 31 May 2009. If an abstract is accepted, the full paper/extended abstract should be submitted by 30 June 2009. Accepted papers will only be included in the final program if the presenting authors have registered before 30 June 2009.
