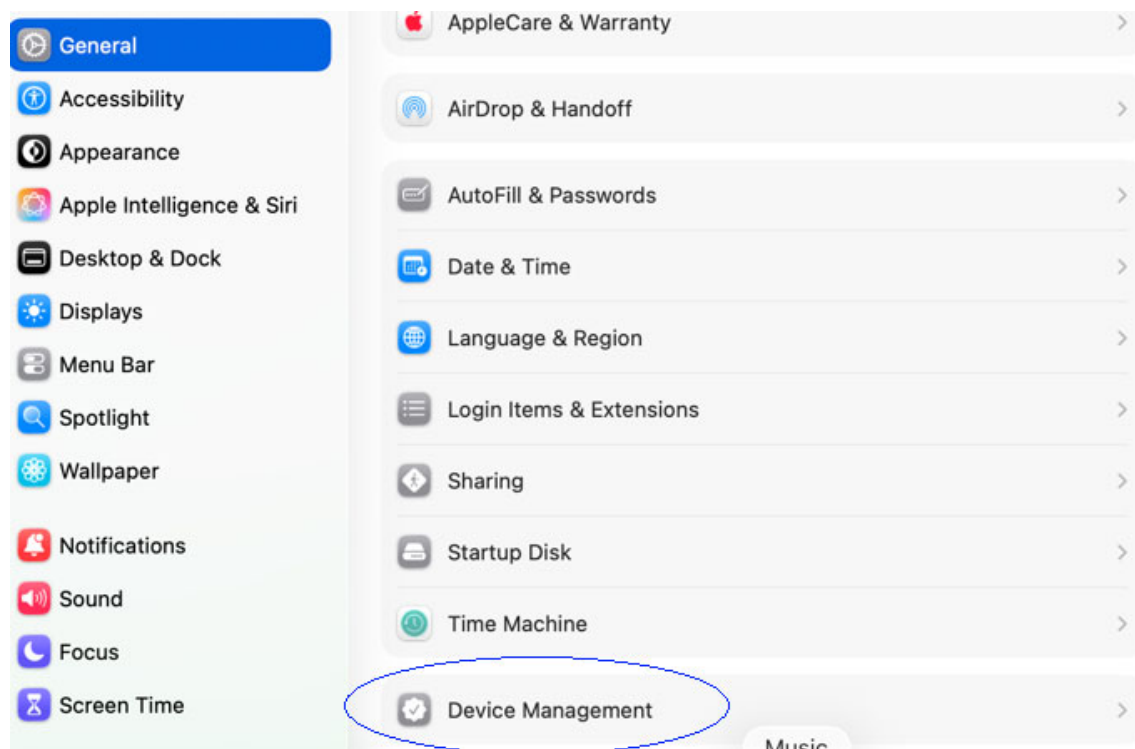

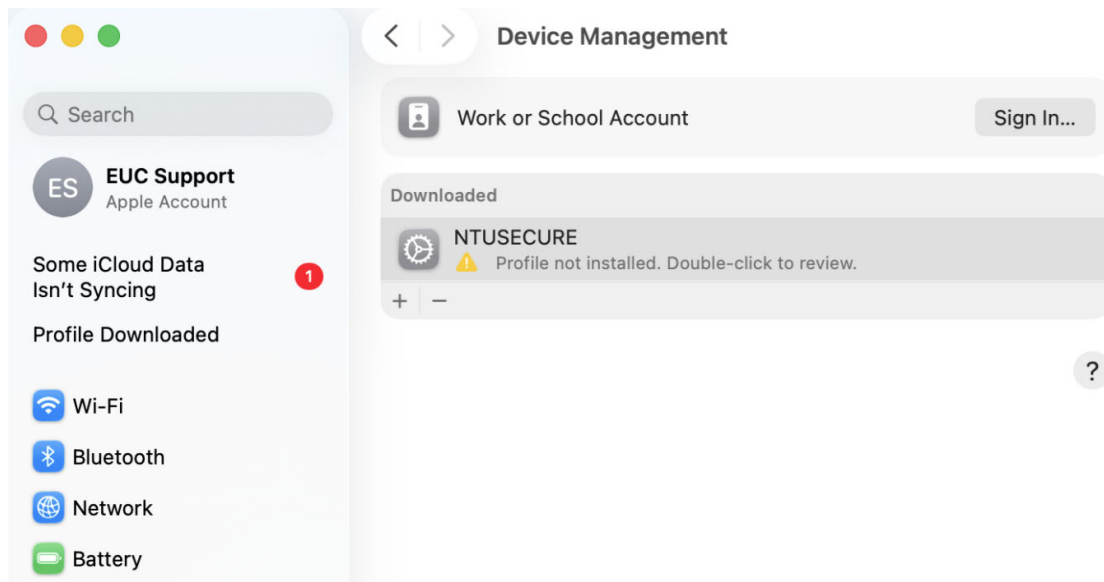
Download the MacOS profile [here](#) and preload the MacBook with it.

By default, the profile config file will reside in the “Downloads” folder

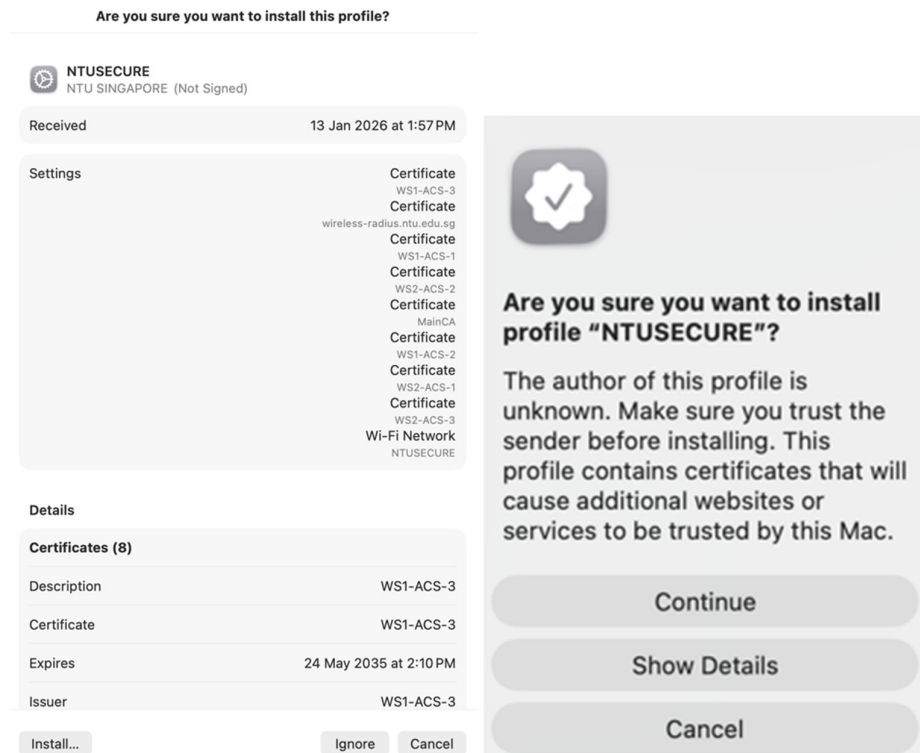
Navigate to “System Settings”, “General”, “Device Management” to proceed to the next installation dialog screen.

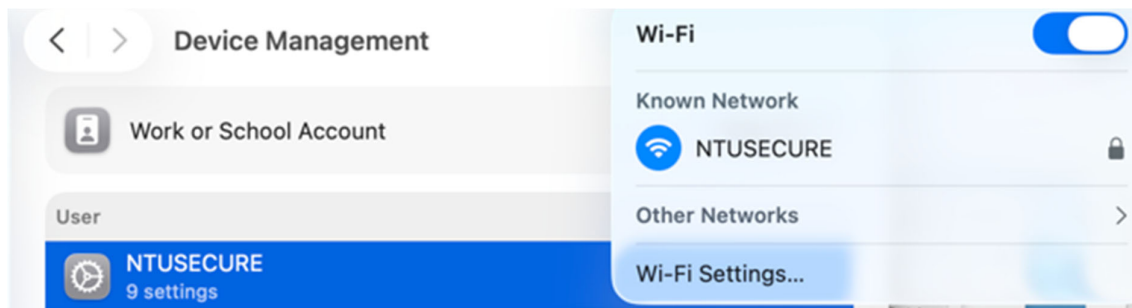

When near a wireless access area, connect to NTUSECURE by clicking on the SSID "NTUSECURE" from the MacBook wireless icon.

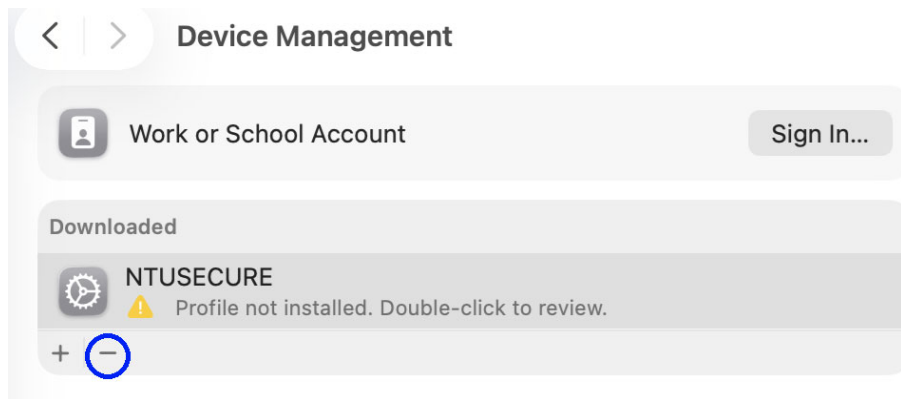

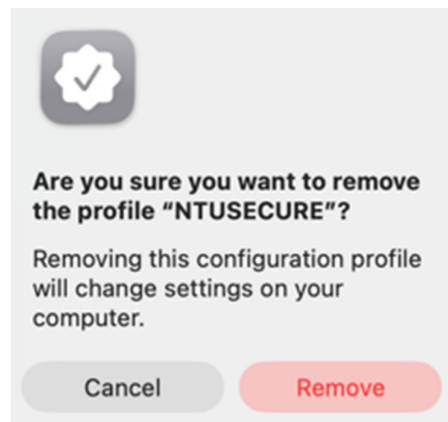
Continue the below steps if there are changes to the username or password.

To remove the profile, navigate to "System Settings", "General", "Device Management"

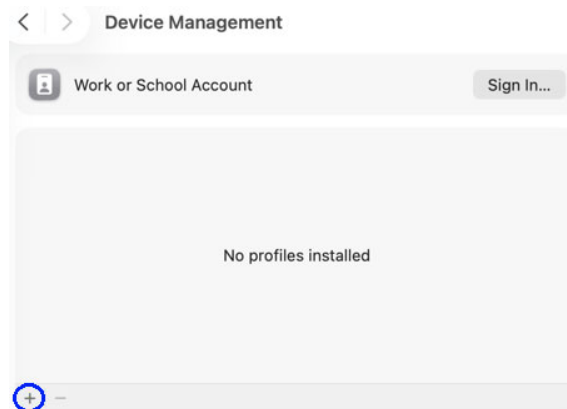
Click on the bottom minus "-" sign to remove the profile.

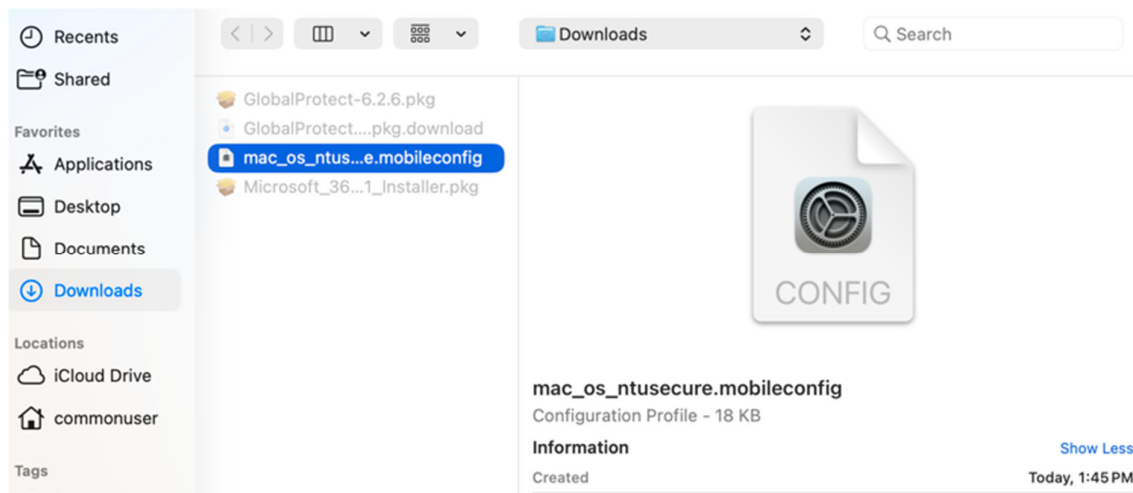


Click “Remove” on the next screen.
