

Sport Science & Management (SSM) Frequently Asked Questions

Question: What is the SSM programme?

Answer: The SSM programme is a 4-year Bachelor of Science (Honours) degree focusing on Sport Science and Sport Management. It is the only sport degree offered by a local autonomous university designed to train and develop professionals to enter and serve the sport industry in Singapore and the region.

Question: What course of study will I follow for this programme?

Answer: Years 1 and 2 of the programme serve as your foundation years where you will complete core courses in both Sport Science and Sport Management. Years 3 and 4 are specialisation years where you choose courses in one discipline or the other. In addition, for Year 4 Semester 1, all students are required to complete a Final Year Project in an area of research of their choice and for Year 4 Semester 2 you will complete a 20-week internship out in industry. There are also some courses to complete which serve as broadening components to your education at NTU. Finally, a small number of your degree courses (10%), termed unrestricted electives, are on offer from across schools at NTU for you to study a range of topics of interest to you.

Question: What are the job prospects with this degree?

Answer: The SSM programme qualifies individuals to work in all areas of the sport industry. For those in Sport Science, areas include Adapted Physical Activity, Coaching and Performance Analysis, Corporate Health and Wellness programmes, Exercise Prescription and Rehabilitation in hospitals, Health Promotion, Physical Education, Sport Injury Management and Rehabilitation, Sport Science Support, Strength and Conditioning, and Workplace Health and Safety. Sport Management major areas include Human Resource Management in Sport, Management of Sport Organisations, Public Relations in Sport, Sport Analytics, Sport Broadcasting and Journalism, Sport Event Management, Sport Facilities Management, Sport Marketing and Sales, Sport Research and Business, Sport Sponsorship and Advertising, and Sport Tourism.

Question: What are the salaries of the graduates?

Question: Does this programme qualify me to be a physiotherapist?

Answer: No, individuals who undertake this programme are not qualified to be physiotherapists. However, students who complete the SSM degree can go on to complete a postgraduate degree in physiotherapy in Australia and some other countries. For individuals wishing to pursue a direct BSc (Honours) undergraduate in physiotherapy, they should approach Singapore Institute of Technology.

Question: What post-graduate programmes can I pursue with this programme?

Answer: This degree programme is recognised globally and qualifies individuals to pursue postgraduate studies in Sport Science or Sport Management. In addition, some past students have also gone on to study postgraduate degrees in other science-related fields (e.g. physiotherapy, medicine, veterinary science).

Question: What are the entry requirements for the programme?

Answer: The exact grade profile for entry onto the course changes each year. Based on the 2019 programme data, the indicative grade profile at the 10th percentile for A-level holders is BCC/C (3H2/1H1) and for Polytechnic students is 3.54 (GPA).

Question: Can I be assessed on my non-academic achievements for entry into the programme?

Answer: Yes, you can be considered for Aptitude-based Admissions (ABA), which takes into account your passions, interests and strengths. Please follow this [link](#) for more details on applying for ABA.

Barker Scholarship, each year to a handful of students to pursue their studies within the programme. The E.W. Barker Scholarship provides approximately \$8,000 per annum to each scholar awarded.
