This course is a foundation module on essential career preparation skills and a compulsory GER-CORE module worth 1 Academic Unit (AU). This course equips you with practical skills needed in your personal development and job search to help you succeed in a new disruptive workplace. This course is open to all Year 2 students. In today's competitive world, it is crucial that career preparation skills are learnt early to ensure that competitive edge is sharpened with a heightened sense of workplace values and ethics.

5. Answer interview questions using the STAR method
6. Identify ethical and workplace related issues

1. **MCQ Assessments:** You are required to watch all videos and complete all MCQ assessment quizzes to check your understanding of the concepts and information shared.

2. **Skills Profiling Report:** You will be directed to a Skills Profiling assessment tool where you will be required to reflect on the skills you have acquired through your previous experiences and identify 3 job options for future exploration. This will aid you in developing a step-by-step career development plan for the next 2 to 3 years.

3. **Resume Submission:** Having assessed your skills competencies and with the learning from the Resume videos, you are required to upload an acceptable Resume into VMock (an online resume critique tool) to receive feedback on areas you have done well in and areas for improvement. The Resume feedback will come in the form of a colour (Green, Amber or Red), you are required to upload a Resume in the Green or Amber zone.

Criteria for Pass

To pass ML0003, you must complete all MCQ Assessments and requirements, and achieve at least 80% of the total marks by the module's closing deadline.

Students who fail to meet the requirements would be deemed to have failed and a 'Fail' grade will be reflected in the Semester's Transcript. Students will need to re-take the module.
