

**CANCELLATION OF TRAINING EMPLOYMENT PASS (TEP)
FOR NON-GRADUATING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS
(INTERNSHIP / SHORT TERM PROJECT)**

TEP students can now proceed to cancel their TEP at International Student Centre (ISC) upon completion of the training attachment with NTU.

Students are to bring along the following items to ISC for the cancellation process:

- Passport
- Training Employment Pass (TEP)

A Short Term Visit Pass (STVP) in the form of a letter will be issued to the students after they surrender their TEP to ISC. That letter legalizes the students' stay in Singapore following the cancellation of their TEP (kindly see attached copy of STVP). The STVP is valid for 30 days from the date of TEP cancellation.

This document serves as a visit pass issued to the foreigner under regulation 12 of the Immigration Regulations. This visit pass is valid from 12/03/2009 until 11/04/2009 or the last date on which the foreigner's passport or other travel document is valid, whichever is the earlier.

This visit pass is issued subject to the conditions that:

- a) the foreigner shall not engage in any form of paid employment or in any business, profession or occupation in Singapore during the validity of this pass, unless he is the holder of a valid work pass issued under the Employment of Foreign Manpower Act (Cap. 91A); and
- b) the foreigner shall not engage in any activity which, in the opinion of the Controller of Immigration, is detrimental to the security and well-being of Singapore.

This document also serves as an embarkation form for the foreigner.

This document should be printed for the foreigner to present together with his/her valid passport or other travel document to the immigration officer for immigration clearance at the point of departure from Singapore. No visit pass will be physically endorsed on the foreigner's passport or other travel document.

Warning:

Overstaying is an immigration offence. If the foreigner overstays, he/she may be subjected to a composition fine or prosecution in court.
