We are looking for a motivated and talented scholar who wants to pursue a Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology on the social cognitive development in infants and young children. Information about the lab's research is available at Early Cognition Lab.

This individual will work within the Ministry of Education Social Sciences and Humanities Research Fellowship "Children's intelligence mindsets: Promoting gender diversity in STEM" with PI Dr. Setoh Peipei at Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore. This project aims to understand Singaporean children and adults' intelligence stereotypes.

The successful candidate will be involved in all levels of the projects, including conducting studies with children and adults in the laboratory and offsite, recruiting and supervising undergraduates, manuscript preparation, presentation of findings in national and international conferences, and providing general support to researchers in the lab. This is an excellent position for someone who loves working with children, wants to gain expertise in cognitive development research while being part of a supportive lab environment that prioritizes professional development. Additionally, you will be part of the vibrant intellectual community in child psychology.

Pre-requisites:

- A Masters / 2nd Class Upper Honours Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Cognitive Science, Neuroscience, or a related field.
- GRE (minimum requirement: Verbal & Quantitative Reasoning 319 out of 340 and Analytical Writing 3.5 out of 6.0)
- Experience working with young children and/or conducting experiments with children and/or adults.
- Proficiency with statistical analysis software (SPSS, R, Stata, etc) is a plus.
- Excellent written and spoken command of English (IELTS: 7).
- Excellent project management, problem-solving and multi-tasking skills.
- Good team player, able to work independently, under pressure and meet deadlines.
