Course Aims

This course seeks to support you in understanding the inner workings of the labor market. The main part of the course focuses on the economics of the labor market and examines effectiveness of public policy in correcting market failures in labour markets. It covers the determination of labor market demand and supply, wage determination, wage differentials, human capital investment, migration and discrimination, as well as unemployment and labor policies. The course also aims to explain why workers join unions, trade union behavior, wage determination under the union, and the economic impact of unions.

- 2. Examine impact of labour unions at the workplace and in society at large
