The course aims to equips you with the basic skillset necessary qualify for a policy research position in the government or the private sector.

- 1. Identify problems that can be addressed with an economics dataset.
- 2. Identify possible economics questions based on knowledge of economics literature.
- 3. Select an appropriate econometric methodology to analyze an economic dataset.
- 4. Identify econometrics methods necessary for critiquing economic policy research.

Students are taught how to identify a plausible economics question and use the tools they have been exposed to argue their case in an economics setting.
