### **Course Aims**

This course will discuss and investigate politics in Asia using a comparative approach. We will be exploring the regions of Northeast Asia, Southeast Asia, South Asia, and Central Asia. We will study the continent through themes such as development, authoritarianism, ethnic violence, civil society, religion, *inter alia*. Empirical cases will be delved into as well, in order to ground the module in real-world occurrences.

### **Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)**

- 1) Identify the major themes relevant to Asian politics.
- 2) Critique the contemporary debates on Asian politics and public policy issues.
- 3) Compare and contrast the various political systems within the continent.
- 4) Examine the academic literature on Asian politics and critically assess it.
- 5) Debate on major political events and issues in Asia and provide constructive suggestions on improvements to the political system and/or public policy.
