

AU EXEMPTIONS FOR POLY STUDENTS

AU Exemption is OPTIONAL

Only use it if you decide that you do not need the 6 AUs

- Applications for AU exemptions must be submitted in your first semester of enrolment in SSS Very important
- 2. No exemptions will be given for the following courses:
 - Major Cores
 - Major Electives
 - Interdisciplinary Collaborative Cores (ICC)
- 3. You may apply for up to a maximum of 6 AU exemptions
 - The number of AUs available for BDE will be reduced accordingly.

AU EXEMPTIONS AND TRANSFER OF CREDIT

VERY IMPORTANT NOTE:

Please think carefully before you apply for exemptions/transfer of credits:

- If you are granted exemptions, you will have fewer AUs in the BDE category to use.
- Exemptions/transfer of credit CANNOT be reversed.
- You will not be granted additional AUs to use in your final year.

BDE AUs are needed to:

- Complete Minors and Second Majors
- Do URECA (Undergraduate Research Experience on Campus)
- Go on semester-long credit-bearing Professional Internship



- 6 failures will be exempted from CGPA calculation.
- Failure will be recorded in transcript.

GRADUATION PROJECT

Clear your major PEs sooner rather than later.

- In order to apply to begin your Graduation Project (HS4099 or HS4098), you must have completed:
 - 95 AUs
 - **All core courses** (must be taken at NTU)
 - At least **7 Major Electives** for a **grade**

If you do major PEs on exchange, it will NOT be graded.

- Compulsory internship as ICC-FC
- It is recommended that students do not take more than 3 other courses during the first semester of HS4099 or HS4098.

PROFESSIONAL ATTACHMENT/INTERNSHIP

Professional Attachment (PA)

• After Year 2 or Year 3. 10 weeks for 5 AUs on a pass/fail basis.

Professional Internship (PI)

- Semester Internship in Year 3 (12 AUs)
- Students can only take credit-bearing PA/PI once.
- Must be completed before Year 4.

Note: students are encouraged take other non-credit bearing internships to explore the possibilities.





EXCHANGE MATTERS

Timing: Either Sem 1 OR Sem 2 in Year 3

Note: Major cores and ICC courses are offered in Years One and Two.

Consider shorter Summer/Winter exchanges

EXCHANGE — NTU REQUIREMENTS

- At least 69 AUs of Graded Courses must be completed in NTU.
- 2. Your **Residential Period** (physical presence on campus) in NTU must be at least **3 years**.
- All Sociology Major Core Courses and ICC courses must be completed in NTU.

EXCHANGE — TRANSFER OF CREDITS

- You are responsible for the transfer of credits.
- A maximum of 3 courses will be counted towards fulfilling Major PEs. Only two courses at the 4000-level are allowed (if you are eligible to take 4000-level courses).
- Important note: these AUs will be pass-fail (non-graded).
- A maximum of 6 courses or 20 AUs will be transferred back to NTU (whichever is fewer)





Make sure you are on track.
