LIP Course


- The University of Osnabrück's main building is the palace.

- It lies also in the German horse breeding country.
- Near to the North Sea where you can visit the islands and the Wattenmeer.



Osnabrück

- Osnabrück is a historic town.
- It was founded in 780 by Charlemagne.
- The town has many romanic, barock, rococo, and art nouveau buildings.
- The university is inside the Schloss (palace) right in the centre of town.
- It is the only town in Germany surrounded by a national park (TERRA.vita).



 - Natur- und Geopark TERRA.vita (national park)

Bremen

- Bremen is much bigger than Osnabrück and is a large Hansestadt.
- With an old town centre it is very interesting for tourists:
 - Bremer Stadtmusikanten (statues dedicated to the fairy tale)
 - Historische Gebäude (historical buildings)
 - Böttcherstraße (historic road)
 - Der Schnoor (medieval part of town)
 - Glockenspiel (chimes)
 - Weserufer (river promanade)







Münster

- Münster is an old town with a complex history. It is also a great example of the destruction caused by bombing during WWII. So you will find many ancient buildings next to totally modern ones:
 - Altstadt (historic town centre)
 - Barockstadt (baroque town)
 - Prinzipalmarkt (main market square)
 - Rathaus (historic town hall/ Westfälischer Frieden)
 - Erbdrostenhof (Schlaun's baroque mansion)
 - Aa und Aasee (Aa river and lake)

TERRA.vita

- TERRA.vita is a UNESCO nature and geo park
- It contains three mountain ranges (uplands):
 - Teuteburger Wald
 - Wiehengebirge
 - Wesergebirge
- There are two long distance trekking routes in it and many opportunities for short walks
- Features many geological highlights, including dinosaur prints
