Course Aims

This course aims to enhance students' proficiency in the Korean language from a lower intermediate level. It achieves this by immersing learners in diverse cultural contexts and introducing more complex sentence structures and colloquial expressions. Through engaging classroom activities, including the use of audio-visual materials and interactive discussion, students are encouraged to actively participate, fostering a deeper understanding of the language. Upon completion of the course, students will have developed the ability to comprehend and communicate effectively in written and spoken Korean across a range of topics and formats. Specifically, LK5004 aims to bring students to a B1.1 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Additionally, this course provides valuable preparation for the Tes Of Proficiency In Korean (TOPIK), a standardized examination assessing proficiency in the Korean language.

Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

After completing LK50004, you will be able to:

- 1. **Communicate** at a lower intermediate level that allows you to express yourself on various issues and exchange information in authentic Korean texts and audio files.
- Read, interpret and comprehend authentic spoken, written and multimedia content on current social issues
- 3. **Apply** Korean grammatical concepts to phrases appropriate for a lower intermediate level.
- 4. **Write** more complex texts dealing with everyday topics, such as comparing different aspects, convey messages, requesting or providing information.
- 5. **Discuss** different aspects of Korean cultures and perspectives along with appropriate commentary, analysis and reflection.

- Classroom Tasks: Prompt feedback and comments are provided for each short inclass learning oral/writing activity, such as summarising group discussions; notes; and oral report, etc.
- **Oral Interview**: This is to develop and guide students to put their learned knowledge into use. Students receive feedback and comments on the spot after the interview.
- **Writing portfolio:** Individual written feedback/comments regarding content and linguistic performance are to be given to each student for each non-summative writing assessment.
- **Video Quiz**: Video quizzes comprising vocabulary and grammar are given at the beginning of each unit. Corrections are given promptly for each exercise.
- **Oral Presentation**: Individual oral feedback on the fluency, pronunciation, contents, structure, communication skills will be given to each student after the summative oral assessment.

Formative feedback

Formative assessment is integrated into the classroom practice to provide feedback on the learning progress to both students and teachers. All assessments in the course must be formative. The feedback will be given in a prompt and informative manner with specific reference to the Intended Learning Outcomes as soon as possible during or after the learning activity.
