# **Course Aims**

This course aims to equip students with the adequate skills and strategies to thrive in Korean and attain an intermediate level of proficiency in the language. It focuses on enabling students to utilize grammar and vocabulary effective in personal interactions and real-life scenarios. Through engaging classroom tasks, such as group discussions covering a range of social and cultural topics, as well as writing composition with diverse content, students are encouraged to actively participate. By the course's conclusion, students should be able to comprehend complex conversations across various subjects and expressing their thoughts through assigned tasks. Those enrolled in LK5005 will meet the B1.2 proficiency standard as per the common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Additionally, this course offers practice in the skills necessary for the TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean ), a standardized assessment of Korean language proficiency.

# Intended Learning Outcomes (ILO)

After completing LK5005 you will be able to:

- 1. **Communicate** at an upper intermediate level, equipping you to converse effectively in a range of situations as well as express, explain and discuss complex or abstract concepts confidently. This will be done bearing in mind the nuances of a Korean context.
- 2. **Comprehend** Korean content, including contemporary social issues and literary works, regardless of medium (written, spoken or multimedia)
- 3. Write more sophisticated texts, (e.g. complaints, reviews and comments on performance / movie, and cover letter for job application) by expanding your grammatical and rhetorical repertoire.
- 4. **Critically engage** with both contemporary societal issues and traditional Korean values through exposure to Korean culture, history and customs.

#### Assessment (includes both continuous and summative assessment)

- **Classroom Tasks**: Prompt feedback and comments are provided for each short inclass learning oral/writing activity, such as summarising group discussions; notes; and oral report, etc.
- **Oral Test**: This is to develop and guide students to put their learned knowledge into use. Students receive feedback and comments on the spot after the interview.
- Writing Portfolio: Individual written feedback/comments regarding content and linguistic performance are to be given to each student for each non-summative writing assessment.
- **Video Quiz**: Video quizzes comprising vocabulary and grammar are given at the beginning of each unit. Corrections are given promptly for each exercise.
- **Oral Presentation**: Individual oral feedback on the fluency, pronunciation, contents, structure, communication skills will be given to each student after the summative oral assessment.

#### Formative feedback

Formative assessment is integrated into the classroom practice to provide feedback on the learning progress to both students and teachers. All assessments in the course must be formative. The feedback will be given in a prompt and informative manner with specific reference to the Intended Learning Outcomes as soon as possible during or after the learning activity.
