A Project to Care for Caregivers for chronically ill children, and encourage Connection within child-caregiver dyads

25 participating dyads of chronically ill children and their caregivers (50 participants)

Bonding Games

- Station Games and Mass Games emphasising dyadic teamwork provided a common activity for dyads to Connect over and facilitated ice-breaking.
- Photographs taken were used in scrapbooking activity.





Dyadic Scrapbooking

- Dyadic-based Scrapbooking activity encouraged dyads to Connect by reflecting on their time together in the games and their relationships and creating a scrapbook page together.
- Dyads were also encouraged to share their reflections and scrapbook pages with one another.







Caregiver
Care Package

- Care Packages for caregivers were curated and packed for distribution to caregivers at the end of the event alongside refreshments for them to practice self-Care after the event.
- Items include a self-designed self-care guide, journalling prompts, journals, writing materials, and other self-care items to help caregivers start exercising self-care (e.g. candles, essential oils, steam eye masks) alongside small refreshments.







Post-Event Feedback

- 17 of 25 participating dyads responded.
- Majority of respondents enjoyed the event and found the activities and care packages to be relevant and meaningful.
- Most respondents looked forward to similar events being held in future, especially for craft activities.
- Areas for improvement include more breaks and earlier refreshments due to the physical exertion from the games.
- Future directions could include scaling up the event to reach more dyads, or caregivers of other demographics (e.g. elderly)
