The Liveability Challenge 2021; Deadline – 15 April 2021

The Liveability Challenge is calling for proposals with the most disruptive, game-changing ideas that will help cities accelerate decarbonisation and address its resource challenges. The Challenge is seeking solutions to address the 50 billion tonnes of carbon emissions released into the atmosphere annually and pollution crisis, which needs a circular economy to replace the existing linear model. All solutions must have proof of concept; At least Technology Readiness Level 6 and must be applicable to Singapore and urban environments in the tropics.


