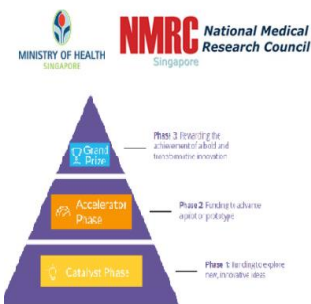

This is a National Medical Research Council (NMRC), Singapore's Competitive Research Grant. It was founded by the United States National Academy of Medicine (NAM), and offers opportunities for innovators, scientists, and entrepreneurs to catalyse breakthrough discoveries and innovations that could leapfrog existing barriers and jumpstart new solutions, thereby propelling the field of ageing research and improving the health of persons as they age.
