A core focus of World Water Day is to support the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030.

FELLOWS SHOWCASE: WANG RONG

Wang Rong, is a Full Professor and President's Chair in Civil and Environmental Engineering at Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore. She also holds the position of Director, Singapore Membrane Technology Centre (SMTCC) at Nanyang Environment and Water Research Institute, NTU. She is a Fellow of the Academy of Engineering Singapore, and the founding President of Membrane Society in Singapore (MEMSIS). She served as the Chair of the School of Civil and Environmental Engineering (CEE) at NTU from 2014 to 2020. She is a membrane scientist working on developing advanced membrane separation technology for water, energy and environmental applications.

- Dr Wang was named among the top SG100 Women in Tech List (SG100WIT) 2021.
- Dr. Wang received the Nanyang Research Award in 2018 and the prestigious "Alternative Water Prize" of the Prince Sultan Bin Abdulaziz International Prize for Water (PSIPW) in 2016.
- Dr Wang's inventions have led the setup of three membrane-based spin-off companies in Singapore.

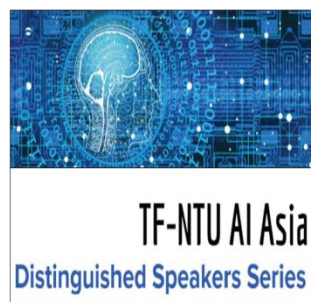


OPEN CALL FOR PROPOSALS - 21 Mar 2022

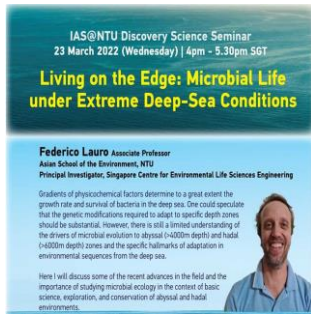

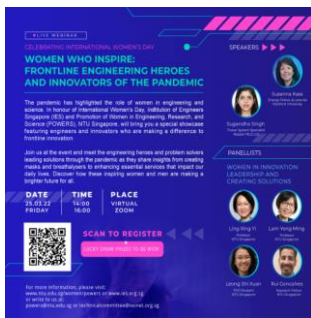

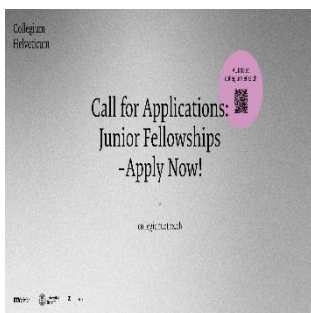
