



# Master of Education (Educational Assessment)

This specialisation provides in-depth knowledge and understanding of assessment theories and practices. Individuals will be equipped to take on leadership roles in assessment at their organisations. No prerequisite knowledge in statistics is required. The requisite knowledge will be taught in the programme.



# **Target Audience**

Educators and university graduates with a background in education who wish to advance their knowledge and skills in areas of assessment and evaluation methods.



# **Entry Requirement**

- · A good Bachelor's degree from a recognised university.
- A teaching qualification such as the Postgraduate Diploma in Education from NIE and at least ONE year of teaching experience; OR
  At least THREE years of teaching experience or other relevant working experience in education.

## **Period of Candidature**

Full-time 1-2 years

Part-time 2-4 years



### Structure

The programme comprises 30 Academic Units (AUs) and offers two options:

· Coursework with Dissertation Route



Coursework Only Route

The offer of electives is reviewed regularly to reflect developments in education and the respective fields. You are advised to take note of the prerequisites (if any) before registering.

Optional Specialisation Courses are offered subject to demand and availability of faculty expertise. Hence, not all specialisation courses are available for selection to every intake.
