STATUTE 5: STUDENT ORGANISATIONS

A. Student Organisations

1. “Student Organisation” means a student organisation duly approved by and registered with the University’s Student Affairs Office, and “Student Organisations” shall be construed accordingly. No Student Organisation shall be recognised as such by the University unless it is duly approved and registered in the manner prescribed by the University.
2. There shall be a Student Organisation, to be known as the Nanyang Technological University Students’ Union (“NTUSU”) which shall comprise Constituent Bodies (“NTUSU Constituent Bodies”) as set out in the Regulation 5.1.
3. In addition to the NTUSU, other Student Organisations (“Non-Constituent Bodies”) may be established in the manner prescribed by the University and as set out in Regulation 5.1.

B. Activities of Student Organisations

1. Student Organisations shall:
 - (a) focus on activities that are consistent with the objectives or purposes for which the Student Organisation was established;
 - (b) ensure that the University is a neutral ground for learning taking into account Singapore’s cultural and social context; and
 - (c) comply with all requirements under Singapore law, including those relating to their establishment and the lawful conduct of their activities.
2. Student Organisations shall not:
 - (a) purvey, disseminate, promote or champion causes or viewpoints which may be against public interest, public order or national harmony or which may be offensive, insensitive or socially divisive, illegal or contrary to national laws or policies;
 - (b) represent the views or opinions of the University without the express consent of the Provost or the Provost’s delegate;
 - (c) discriminate against any member or any student on the basis of age, race, nationality, creed, gender, physical disability or any basis which would be inconsistent with the non-discrimination laws of Singapore;
 - (d) affiliate itself with any political party, render itself to be identified with any partisan political position, or engage in or make any pronouncement on matters of a

political nature¹; and

- (e) use the University's name, brands or acronyms associated with the University and/or any University logo without obtaining approval in accordance with the University's Intellectual Property (IP) Policy.
3. The Provost or the Provost's delegate shall be empowered to make rules and regulations governing Student Organisations and their activities, including granting approvals for fundraising and donation.
